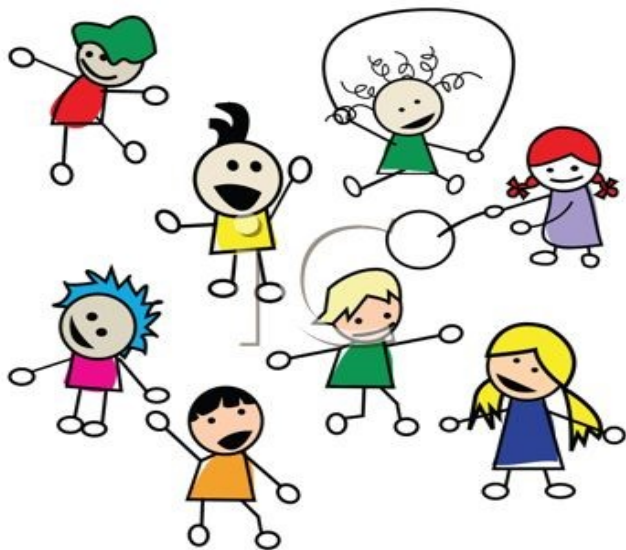

If you play Euchre, we need players on Wednesday, 12:30 p.m.

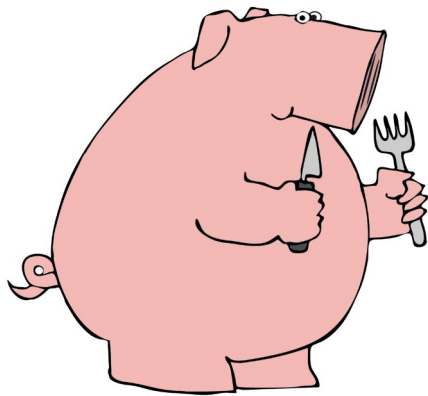
Porkapalooza 2015 coming To NSC
