
There will be pulled pork sandwiches and pink-iced cupcakes along with some fillers, like potato salad and coleslaw.



Porkapalooza orders now being accepted

Porkapalooza 2018 is right around the corner on October 12 and 13. Orders for exceptionally tasty pork ribs, tenderloins and pulled pork by the quart will be taken beginning September 1. We ask that you pre-pay for your orders if at all possible.

Ribs are \$25 a slab, tenderloins are \$15 each or two for \$25 and pulled



Monthly food program has several openings

We are a distribution center for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program of the USDA. If you are at least 60 years old, live in Warrick County and meet the income guidelines (annually, \$15,444 or \$1,287 per month), you may qualify for a food box every month. Colleen Martin will help you fill out the application. Distribution is on the fourth Friday of each month.

Items in the food box typically include four cans of vegetables; either dry beans or peanut butter; shelf stable milk; a 2-pound block of cheese; canned meat, stew or chili; powdered milk on alternate months; cereal; two cans of fruit; pasta or rice; juice.

Exercise equipment available


Our board would like us to clear out some space for other activities, so we are offering several pieces of exercise equipment to the first group or persons who reply. Make us an offer.

Thanks a thousand times over to the Alcoa volunteers who built the raised beds for us last year.


We're collecting breakfast items, snacks for Warrick Education Center
