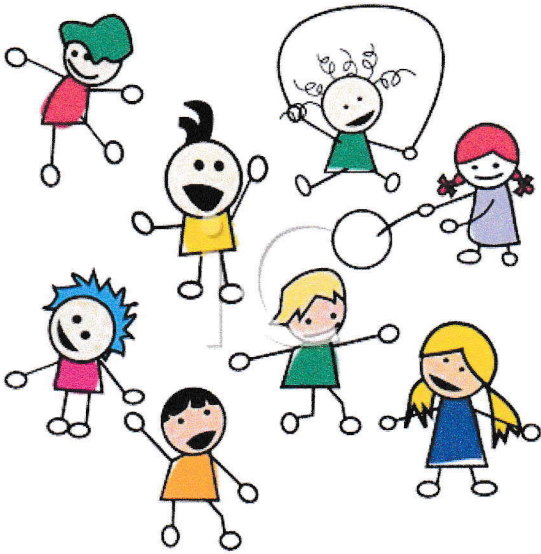
This will be Nancy's last day as manager, so she'd like to see everyone to say farewell.

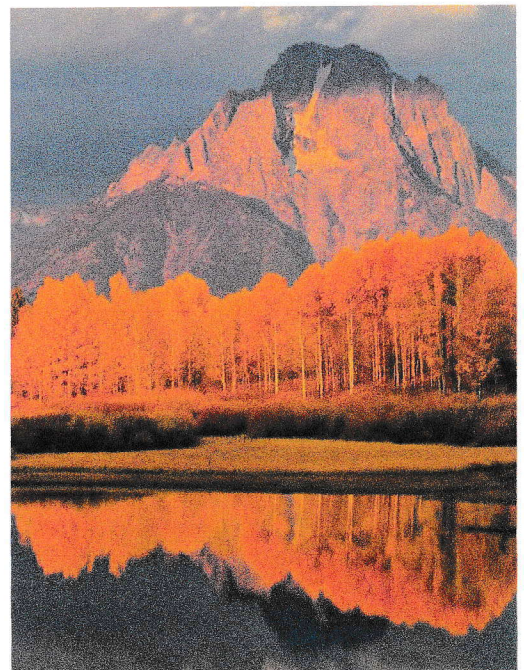

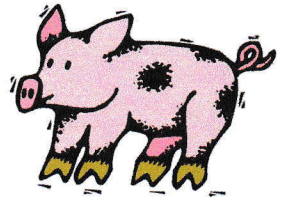
