We are back to masking up again at the Center. Everybody who enters the building **MUST** wear a mask – and that means up over your nose and mouth.

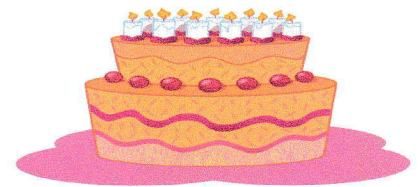
We are even back to worrying whether or not we'll need to close. We'll keep you posted. Stay safe, my friends.

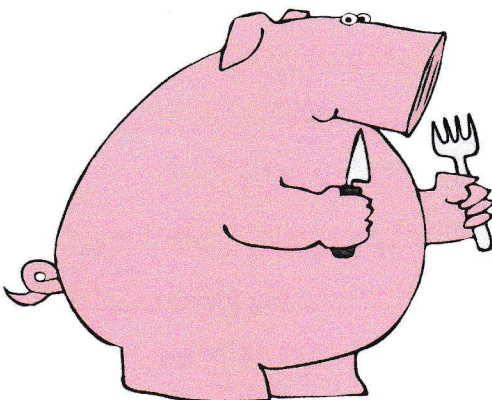
