Special programs planned for seniors for grief, anxiety treatment options

Ascension St. Vincent Health Care has two new programs for outpatient mental health services for seniors. A representative is planning to be at our Senior Center on two different occasions to discuss how the programs work.

The Harmony Program for adults 55 and older is a group therapy project to help with depression and/or anxiety. As we get older, we are more likely to find ourselves alone and lonely. Clinical depression can get worse if we don't get it treated.

We all tend to worry more as we age. Anxiety can sneak up on us; normal

concerns turn into something we can't get a handle on. That's when we need to seek outside help.

The other outreach program is for seniors overwhelmed with grief and grieving. We've all lost friends and family through death, moving, disagreements, separation or other reasons. Grieving such losses is normal. But there is a point at which we need professional help in dealing with the sadness.

Julie Morrow, Community Education Manager with Ascension St. Vincent, will be with us on Wednesday, June 11 at noon to discuss grief and treatment

options through The Harmony Program.

She'll be back with us July 30 at noon to talk about depression and anxiety treatments through The Harmony Program.

You may not feel that you need treatment for grief, depression or anxiety, but you may know others who might benefit from this. Listening for options will give you information you may need some day or that you can pass along to other seniors.

Vaccination clinic offered to seniors

NSC and the Indiana Department of Health are sponsoring a mobile vaccination clinic on Friday, June 6 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Come on in and get shots. The clinic is open to all Seniors, 50 and older.

Vaccinations that will be offered include measles/mumps/rubella; RSV;

pneumonia; and tetanus. Jared Goodman said no flu or Covid vaccines will be available in June because the "season" is over. He said those vaccines will be available after September and we can have another visit by the mobile unit at that time.
